

## Fally Sène Sow : The Chaos of God

Fally Sène Sow's works, inspired by a desire to wipe the slate clean, offer a new perspective on the cycle of life. This series of recent paintings is inspired by the artist's installation at the Dakar Biennale 2022, the highlight of the event and acquired by the Fondation Blachère. This 30 m2 model, entitled "Rusty World", recreated the Colobane roundabout - the nerve centre of Dakar - to show a city ravaged by a global pandemic.

Continuing his reflection on the notion of ecological apocalypse, Sène Sow has taken Fally inspiration from the imperative need for 'Regeneration' ('Dekkal' in Wolof), imposed by a changing world. Although some of the motifs in these paintings reveal skulls or decomposing skeletons, they are not reminiscent of the vanitas of the old Western masters.





Their meaning and their role in the cycle of life are to be found in a very African interpretation: they no longer symbolise the fragility of human life or death, but are the nurturing ground for that famous "Regeneration" that Fally Sène Sow so earnestly hopes for.

In other canvases, the artist imagines what might adorn the tables of the houses in his 'Rusty World' model, such as close-ups of kitchens, living rooms, etc. In this way, he reinterprets the still life genre by incorporating elements of local culture.

Using a multitude of materials applied to canvas, Fally Sène Sow, a self-taught artist, produces his works by composing with pigments, filasse, plastic and materials taken from the ground. These decomposing materials are a humus, a metaphor for the cycles of the soul and the carnal envelope, enabling her to create a flamboyant ecosystem like a Garden of Eden before the arrival of humanity. A form of reparation.



## Fally Sène Sow

Born in 1989 in Senegal Lives and works in Dakar

Fally Sène Sow follows in the footsteps of the masters of the Ecole de Dakar, initiated by President Senghor at the time of Senegal's independence, the painters and weavers of the Thiès tapestries, to free himself from the phenomena of fashion to develop a unique body of work, imbued with Senegalese heritage, to convey universal messages.

Fally Sène Sow's works, inspired by the desire to make a clean sweep of the past, offer a new perspective on the cycle of life. For the 2022 Dakar Biennale, he recreated the Colobane roundabout, the nerve centre of Dakar, in a gigantic scale model of 30m2.

In this new series of paintings, he imagines what might adorn the tables of the houses he reproduces, a close-up view of kitchens, living rooms, etc. He reinterprets the still life genre by incorporating elements of local culture.
